Mules & Donkeys are stubborn!

MYTH!

Mules & Donkeys have high self preservation and like to think through situations before deciding on what to dothis can be perceived as stubborn but in reality they are trying to do what they think they're supposed to do- or doing what they think they have to do to survive. Patience is a key trait to have when working with all equines! Especially mules and donkeys!

Mules live longer than horses!

FACT!

Mules are hybrids- therefore have something called "hybrid vigor" from their different parents. A horse's lifespan can get to 25-30yrs, a donkey can be 27-40yrs, while mules can get 35-50yrs! (These are all lifespans of DOMESTIC equines- wild equines average less)

Mules have an odd number of chromosomes!

FACT!

Mules are HYBRIDS - a cross between a horse and donkey- therefore they have a mismatch of chromosomes. This also means they are incapable of breeding as their sperm and egg cells cannot form correctly.

<u>Horses are more trainable than mules or donkeys!</u> - MYTH

Horses, mules, and donkeys alike- are all trainable; with both pros and cons of their natural features (which are pros or cons are dependent on YOUR beliefs). Though there are some generalizations of differences- ultimately each animal should be approached at an individual level with their own personalities and physical capabilities considered when training is approached.



What is the difference between a MULE & a HINNY?

A **MULE**'s mother is a horse and their father is a donkey - Whereas a **HINNY**'s mother is a donkey and their father is a horse!
